

Phase 2

COVID-19 Guidelines — Beginning April 2

- Masks required in the building and may be removed once seated
- Social distancing observed
- Portion of the sanctuary balcony reserved for those wearing masks
- Bibles and hymnals to be replaced in sanctuary pews

Programming — Beginning April 11

- In-person programs extended including Adult Sunday School classes, Sunday evening children's programs, Midweek dinner, and the church bookstore
- Limited Midweek dinner (registration required for boxed dinner pickup)
- Adult "Age and Stage" Sunday School classes resume (April 11)
- Choir capacity incrementally increased

Phase 3

COVID-19 Guidelines — Beginning May 2

- Masks optional in worship services, Midweek, and Sunday School programs
- Portion of the sanctuary balcony to be reserved for those wearing masks and social distancing
- Offering plates to be passed again

Programming — Beginning May 2

- In-person programs extended
- All departments maintain regularly scheduled programming as introduced during Phase 2
- Choir rehearsals will resume in full as the health situation improves and wisdom dictates

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

THE DAY THE PASTOR GOT CONVERTED

Last month my wife and I drove to New Orleans to visit the United States Customs and Immigration Service regional office. We were told to come dressed for a formal occasion, and to bring certain documents with us. When we arrived, there were about twenty other people waiting; people from Africa, Asia, and Latin America, all dressed-up and nervous. When the appointed time came, we were ushered through security, and given a seat until we were called to a short interview where we had to sign some documents. Then we were all ushered into a large hall with chairs arranged in rows. In front, there was a dais and a podium with the "Great Seal of the United States" on it. We each took our seats when two officials entered. We were then addressed on our duties and privileges, reminded of certain opportunities, and given instruction on what to do next. Then we were asked to stand and raise our right hands and swear an oath disavowing all other allegiance and pledging ourselves as brand-new citizens of the United States of America to serve our country and to do "works of national importance when called upon to do so."

It was a solemn and deeply moving experience, the terminus for us of a long and demanding process that began thirteen years earlier when we first arrived in Mississippi. Now, at long last, we are dual citizens of both the United Kingdom and the United States. I have come to love my adopted country very deeply, and while I've visited many parts of it, I've only ever lived in Mississippi. It's hot and humid, flat and forested. Its rivers are muddy, its highways long and straight. Its biggest city isn't very big at all. But its people... its

people are kind and hospitable, generous and polite, and the welcome we have received here has helped us love this land we have now come to call home. I am proud to be a Mississippian.

As we left the citizenship ceremony that day, it struck me how similar it had all been to a religious rite. It was formal and decorous, the matters discussed were weighty and joyful at the same time. We sat in rows and listened to an address celebrating our 'conversion,' and instructing us on the life we must now live. We chanted in unison the vow that brought us from one world into another. We arrived citizens of foreign lands, and we all left that day, transformed into Americans.

And yet, for all my gratitude for my earthly citizenship in this amazing country, it is that my citizenship is in heaven that gives me greatest joy. I have been enrolled in the Lamb's book of life, and welcomed into the fellowship of the people of God. The Church is our King's earthly embassy, and there something far more thrilling happens than ever could happen at a US citizenship ceremony. In the church, and through the gospel of Jesus Christ that we proclaim, citizens of the world are made into citizens of the Kingdom of heaven. And that is more than an administrative change: we are born again into the family of God, raised to new life in union with Christ, made members of the Israel of God from the inside out. For all the relief and joy that attended the citizenship ceremony, how much more ought we to rejoice, along with the angels in heaven, over one sinner who repents! May we witness many new citizens of the Kingdom of Christ in the years ahead!


